


Setting Up your quick access dashboard

The BASA Members-only area of the website has two main zones with all of the important documents posted each week – the Working/Project Groups and the General Content zone.

Working/Project Groups


1. You do not have to belong to the working/project group to access the content.
2. You do need to be a member of the working group to access the meeting information.

When you log on you may see something like this:


If you click on the red box, you will then see:

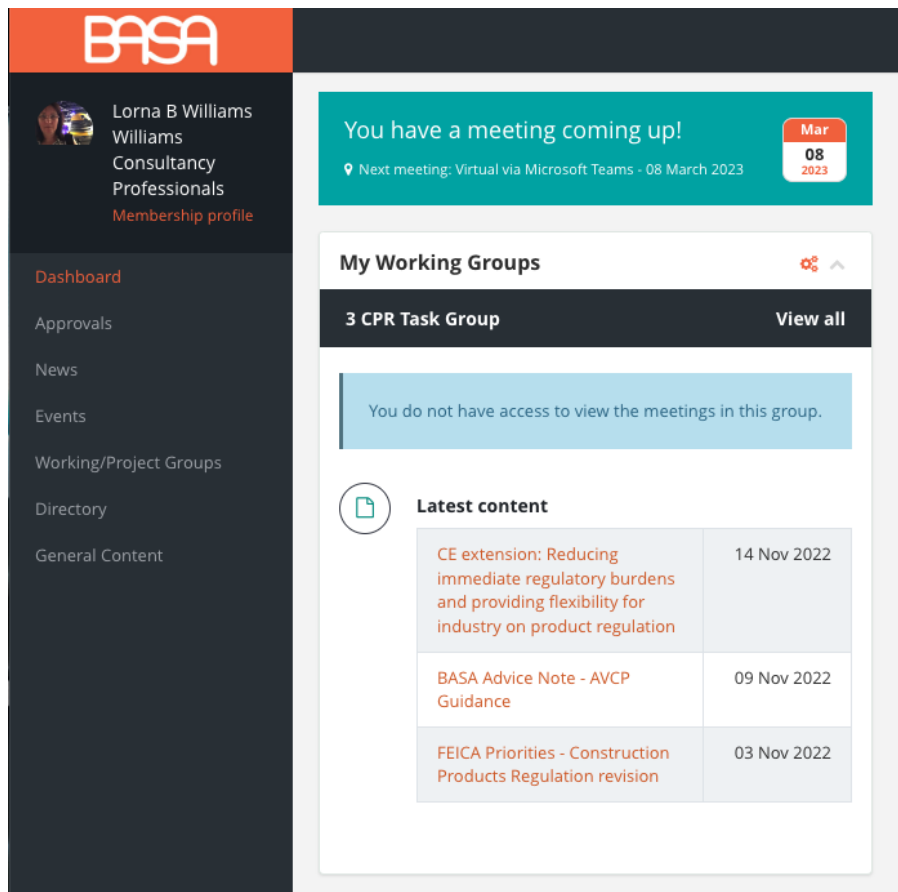
And this will allow you to choose which groups you want displayed on your dashboard. All group content can always be accessed by clicking on the Working/Project Groups regardless of whether you have added to your own dashboard (in Orange in the screenshot above).

If you just, select the group of main interest (in this example the CPR Task Group):



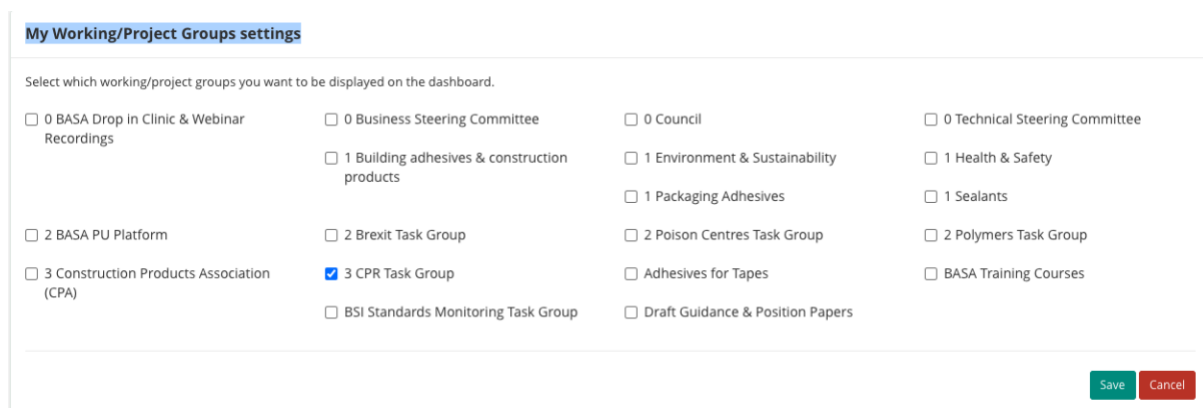

And then click Save (green button), then this is what you will see when you log in:



Your selected content (My Working Groups) is chosen for your main areas of interest, and you do not have to be a member of the group to select it for your quick access dashboard.

Once you have selected groups for your dashboard for the first time, you can amend your selection at an time by using the orange cogs to the right of 'My Working Groups'. Clicking on the orange cogs will take you back to the 'My Working/Project Groups settings' options.



Selecting multiple groups will stack the groups in the left hand column on the dashboard.

General Content

All general content appears on the dashboard automatically, or can be accessed by clicking on the General Content option.

Do I need to notify my polymers to poison centres?
Article 45 notification obligations do not apply to polymers as polymers are considered to be substances. Although, where a polymer is an ingredient in a mixture then that must be included in the notification of that mixture (as a component of that mixture). The polymer name and an identification number as described in Article 18(2) of CLP should be provided. Where no EC, CAS or IUPAC details are available, you can report the known name in the 'IUPAC name' field in the Reference Substance document. Monomers are not required to be declared.

As a UK based legal entity if I make poison centre notifications via the harmonised portal before 31/12/20 will I have met my European obligations?
The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) clarified this matter by stating: 'After 31 December 2020, it will not be possible for UK companies to make submissions via the Portal. As a UK based legal entity, any information submitted by UK companies via the Portal before 31 December 2020 will remain in the database, however it will be linked to a company that has no obligations after this time. Note that there is no 'assets transfer' process, therefore notifications that had been made by the UK supplier in the EU

What do new suppliers of existing substances have to do under EU and UK REACH regulations
Both EU and UK REACH Registration is per substance, per legal entity and therefore new suppliers cannot rely on existing registrations and must ensure that they have met their legal obligations if they intend to place more than 1T per annum of a substance that requires registration.
