Transport changes ADR 2023

General Changes

There is only one new UN number: UN3550 COBALT DIHYDROXIDE POWDER, containing not less than 10 % respirable particles

The UN number 1169 has been deleted and the entry for UN number 1197 has been amended to read: "1197 EXTRACTS, LIQUID, for flavour or aroma". There are also new special provisions 396, 397, 398 and 676.

Chapter 1 changes

Within Chapter 1 there have been a number of changes to the definitions, they have either been updated, deleted or added.

There are new paragraphs;

- 1.1.4.7 Refillable pressure receptacles authorized by the United States of America Department of Transportation
- 1.1.4.7.1 Import of gases

Refillable pressure receptacles authorised by the United States of America Department of Transportation and constructed and tested in accordance with standards listed in Part 178, Specifications for Packagings of Title 49, Transportation, of the Code of Federal Regulations accepted for carriage in a transport chain in accordance with 1.1.4.2 may be carried from the location of the temporary storage at the end point of the transport chain to the end user.

- 1.1.4.7.2 Export of gases and empty uncleaned pressure receptacles

Refillable pressure receptacles authorised by the United States of America Department of Transportation and constructed in accordance with standards listed in Part 178, Specifications for Packagings of Title 49, Transportation, of the Code of Federal Regulations may be filled and carried only for the purpose of exporting to countries which are not Contracting Parties to ADR provided the following provisions are met:

The filling of the pressure receptacle is in accordance with the relevant requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations of the United States of America;

The pressure receptacles shall be marked and labelled in accordance with Chapter 5.2;

The provisions of 4.1.6.12 and 4.1.6.13 shall apply to pressure receptacles. Pressure receptacles shall not be filled after they become due for periodic inspection but may be carried after the expiry of the time-limit for purposes of performing inspection, including the intermediate carriage operations."

Chapter 1 also sees the addition of three new new transitional measures:

- "1.6.5.23 EX/III vehicles first registered or entering into service before 1 January 2029, in accordance with the requirements of 9.7.9.2 applicable until 31 December 2022, but which do not conform to the requirements of 9.7.9.2 applicable as from 1 January 2023, may continue to be used."
- "1.6.5.24 FL vehicles first registered or entering into service before 1 January 2029, which do not conform to the requirements of 9.7.9.1 applicable as from 1 January 2023, may continue to be used."
- "1.6.5.25 FL vehicles first registered or entering into service before 1 January 2029, which do not conform to the requirements of 9.7.9.2 applicable as from 1 January 2023, may continue to be used."

Far more detail has been added on the obligations of the competent authority and the obligations of the inspection

bodies in ADR 1.8.6.2 and ADR 1.8.6.3

Conclusions

This is NOT all of the proposed changes, just a selection of the most relevant changes — you MUST check the regulations or ask your Dangerous Goods Safety Advisor (DGSA) if you are unsure of the regulations. I am happy to help, email: caroline.raine@gmail.com.

Remember, ADR 2023 is applicable from 1 January 2023 and mandatory from July 2023.

New CLP Hazard Classes

New hazard classes are being proposed by the European Commission for inclusion into the Classification, Labelling and Packaging regulations (CLP).

Introduction

The European Commission has issued a consultation on a draft new Regulation that would introduce new hazard classes as part of a revision of the Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 (the CLP Regulation) on classification, labelling and packaging of substances and mixtures (CLP Regulation).

This consultation opened on the 21st September 2022 and closed on the 18th October 2022. *We will update members when the results of the consultation come out.*

The proposed amendments to the CLP Regulation includes entries in Annex I Classification and labelling requirements for hazardous substances and mixtures to introduce new hazard classes for disruptors for human health and endocrine disruptors for the environment.

Both the endocrine disruptors for human health and disruptors for the environment have Categories one and two with Category one and two for disruptors for human health are defined as "Known or presumed endocrine disruptors for human health" and "Suspected endocrine disruptors for human health".

In a similar fashion hazard classifications for endocrine disruptors for the environment has two categories Category one "Known or presumed endocrine disruptors for the environment" and Category two "Suspected endocrine disruptors for the environment".

The proposal also includes hazard labelling for endocrine disruptors.

Both the endocrine disruptors for human health and for the environment have been given Generic concentration limits triggering classification of a mixture as either Carcinogen Category one or two.

The proposal also includes proposals for classification of substances as

- Persistent, Bioaccumulative and Toxic (PBT) or Very Persistent, Very Bioaccumulative (vPvB) properties; and
- Persistent, Mobile and Toxic (PMT) or Very Persistent, Very Mobile (vPvM)

Regulatory Update

If you get the weekly email updates, you will be well aware of the huge number of documents processed by the consultancy team here at BASA over the last few months. Don't receive these emails? [Click here for Instructions for receiving automatic email notifications.](#)

We are working hard to stay on top of both the EU chemicals and products regulation as well as the UK regulations now that we have left the EU. It is certainly very challenging, and we are already starting to see both accidental and deliberate divergence from EU decisions.

Product related regulations are mainly focussed on construction products at the moment, although we keep a close eye on food contact issues as well. UKCA marking continues to be a nightmare with government making comments that we have all had two years to prepare, without acknowledging that without a UK Approved Body, affixing UKCA marking is not possible.

The legal advice remains that because the legislation still has not been changed, that without a UKAB report or certificate, manufacturers should only affix CE marking. However, retailers will



not easily accept this argument when they are being told that from 1st January 2023 all products should have UKCA marking, despite this NOT being in the legislation!

UKREACH is also a huge issue for Downstream users, with the much smaller UK market size for substances and lack of UK substance manufacturers pushing all the expense and obligations on downstream users who will all become first time REACH registrants unless changes are considered. BASA in conjunction with many other chemical associations fear that many substances and products will disappear from the GB market, and in fact there is a very real fear that some EU adhesives and sealants manufacturers may look to supply end users directly to avoid UKREACH obligations.

Social Responsibility and our Commitment to Giving

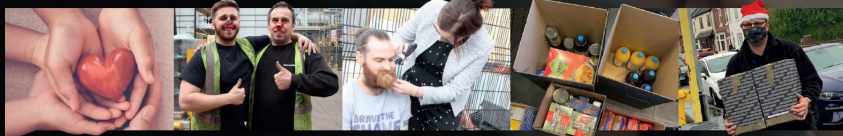
We take a proactive and committed approach to increasing the representation of local people in our workforce and currently, 40% of our employees live within a 15 mile radius of the Tamworth office.

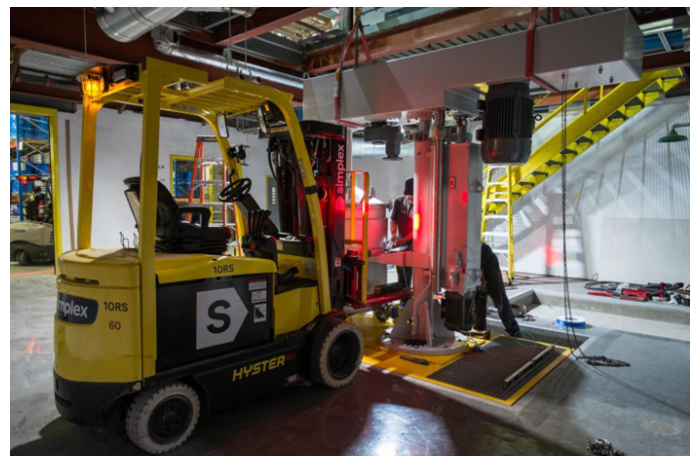
Scott Bader invests in North America

It will be the company’s second North American manufacturing site; the new development is expected to create 27 new jobs locally, with 21 in manufacturing and the other roles shared across HR, R&D, commercial support and applications.
