The Role

We are seeking an outstanding teacher of Flute and Recorder to join our excellent team of visiting music teachers.

The role is for a self-employed teacher who is able to teach one-to-one lessons on flute and recorder to boys from Year 2 to Year 8. You will have a strong track record of preparing children and young people for ABRSM music grades. In addition you will coach flute and recorder ensembles for our major concerts in the Michaelmas and Summer terms and prepare boys for our informal concerts, which take place from time to time.

We have a bespoke Music Department with numerous music practice rooms for the use of



individual pupils and teachers.

Teaching takes place during the school day, and in the case of Flute and Recorder, this is on a Monday.

The School will organise a timetable for the Flute and Recorder Teacher to coincide with the main School timetable.

The rate of pay is £27.50 per 30-minute lesson if the School is responsible for invoicing, or £28.50 per 30-minute lesson if the teacher is directly responsible for invoicing parents.
